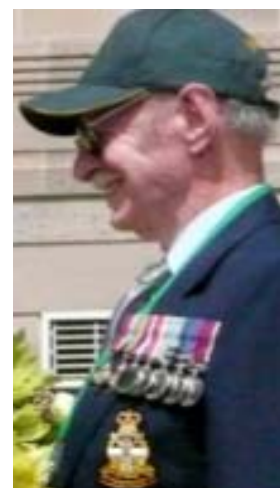

Vale – Fred Millar, Honorary Trustee

We regret to advise that Fred Millar, Trustee for five years, passed away on 26th February 2014. His funeral service was held in Frankston on 3rd March. Fred was indeed a unique character and a strong and loyal supporter of the AAAA.

Prior to WWII, except for light repairs to military vehicles and some signals equipment, repairs were conducted by Ordnance Corps Workshops. In 1939, the Army decided to expand and to adopt the British Army "Boy Tradesmen" scheme, with a trial in Tasmania. Fred was selected and enlisted as an "Army Apprentice", to Anglesea Barracks workshop, on 10th Jul, aged 16.



From 1939 to 1969, Fred was posted to 10 MT Workshop, 9 Watercraft Workshop, Milne Bay and Tasmania Command Workshop; attended courses in UK; was posted to 7 Armoured Division, Germany; assisted with the atomic tests in the Monte Bello Islands; was commissioned; was posted to RAEME Training Centre, Ingleburn, 18 National Service Battalion, Seymour Area Workshop, 101 Infantry Workshop, 28 Brigade British Gurkha Division, the Army Apprentices School, Deputy Assistant Director EME Central Command, and Central Command Workshop; and, after retiring as a LTCOL, served in the CMF for two years.

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I encourage all Apprentices to join in on their respective reunions – our time as Apprentices was a defining period in our lives and cemented our commitment to our nation.

Shortly, the Federal Government will announce the ballot for the 2015 100th anniversary of the ANZAC landings at Gallipoli. If any Apprentice is chosen to go, then I would hope that he or she will carry some tangible symbol of the Apprentices Association with our ANZAC history (maybe a giant crab).

I am pleased that our Website redevelopment has completed its design phase after many months and I congratulate all those involved in bringing it up to date with new features. (It will roll out soon – Editor.)

Finally I would like as many of us as possible to attend our AGM, which will be held at Bandiana, Victoria on Saturday 25th October, commencing at 1000 hours (location to be confirmed).

Jim Hislop, 9th Intake (RAEME) has accepted the position of Trustee of our Association and we thank him for agreeing to fulfil this important role. I believe we need to continually look to promoting our heritage and there is no one better placed or experienced than Jim. Congratulations.

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Fred invented the Millar Bridge for vehicles to cross obstacles using steel wire ropes – adopted by the Australian and British Armies and the Geological Svy Dept in Guadalcanal to replace bridges destroyed in WWII. In civilian life, Fred was a stockbroker, a merchant banker, the MD of two companies, service manager for Mazda Australia in Victoria/Tasmania, owner/manager of a take-away food business, a management consultant, and he patented water purification technologies.

AAAA Memorial

Dedicated on 26th October 2008 to all Apprentices who supported the Australian Army in war and peace, the **Memorial** allows Apprentices and their families to record, by means of inscribed pavers or plaques, their place as Army Apprentices and may also be used as a resting place for their ashes. It incorporates many icons of Apprenticeship days so visitors can reminisce on their time at the Army Apprentices School and remember mates no longer with us.

Recent changes include the boulder with engraved names of Apprentices who died on active service. This was originally part of the RAEME Memorial and was given by RAEME to the Association. The **Reflection Seat**, donated by Jock McWhinney (10th Blacksmith), allows visitors to rest and reflect on the values that the Army Apprentice Scheme gave to the Army and to each person who passed that way.

The President reports that there are four separate Apprentice Groups and several Intake-specific Groups currently running on Facebook. The largest Group is specific to Bonegilla but Barry has been accepted as a member of this Group; at the time of writing, it has 672 members. This exceeds the Group he began several years ago (Army Apprentices Association [Australia]), currently with 474 members. The other two Groups have 247 and 202 members respectively.

Barry suspects that the four Groups have some common members but feels that an audit would probably show that more than 700 Apprentices are active on Facebook. He posts matters on all four Groups when asked to disseminate information. That way everyone gets to see the information.

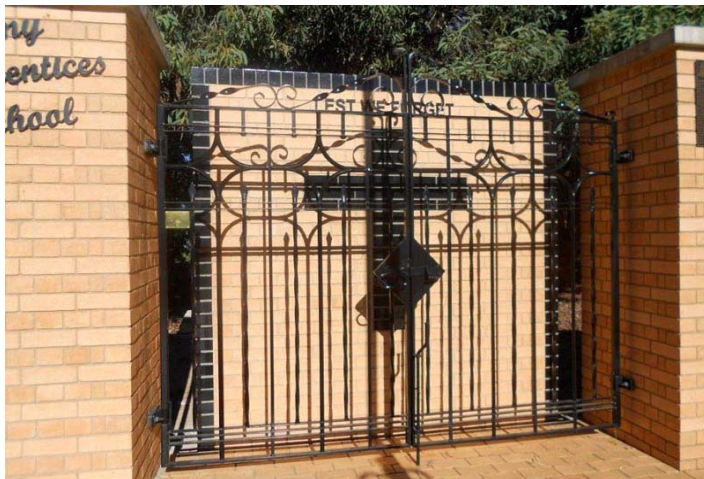

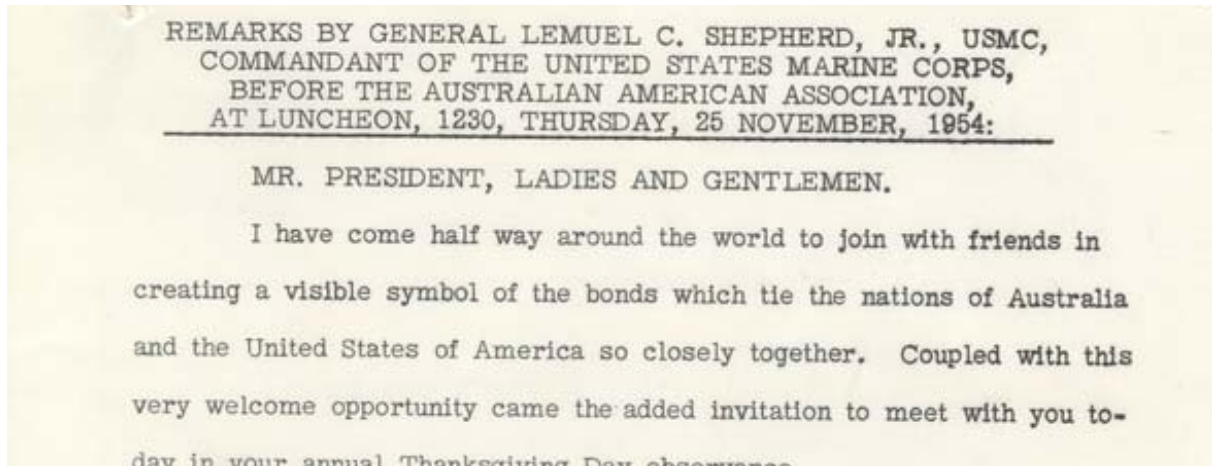


SPAASSM Collection DVD

Constitution changes

At the upcoming AGM in October, the Committee will be proposing amendments to the Association Constitution. All members are welcome to propose such amendments and are invited to participate in the review. Below is a brief summary of the current proposed changes. Prior to the AGM, the finalised proposed changes will be advised to all members in time to consider them for approval at the AGM.

- Amend para 10 to allow the Committee to set fees without having to amend the Constitution.
- Insert new para 18, "Custody and use of common seal", to comply with the ACT Incorporations Act.
- Delete Committee and other forms to simplify changing them without having to amend the Constitution.
- Amend Annex A to ensure that Committee positions may only be drawn from the Association membership.
- Amend Annex A to limit Appointments (eg Patron, Trustee, etc) to a tenure of three years, although they will be eligible for re-appointment.
- Amend Annexes A and C to strengthen the description of the structure and role of the Memorial Subcommittee.

Defence Force Welfare Association (DFWA) update www.dfw.org.au

The AAAA is a paid-up Group Member of the DFWA, and supports the DFWA's efforts to achieve fair indexation for all DFRB/DFRDB pensioners, retirees under the MSBS scheme, and DVA Disability Pensioners. The DFWA Monthly Update #282 – February 2014 included some great news on the "Fair Go" campaign":

"Yes.....the injustice for which DFWA and its partners in the Alliance of Defence Service Organisations (ADSO) have fought for many years will soon, at least in part, see remedy. The superannuation pensions of DFRB/DFRDB recipients over 55 will, with effect 1 July 2014, be indexed in the same way as age and service pensions. The hard work of a dedicated band of unified ex brothers and sisters-in-arms over 20 years will finally accrue a small dividend."

This was, however, not the full solution sought by the ADSO and the leadership group continued its dialogue with the Government to achieve a better result for all DFRB/DFRDB pensioners, retirees under the MSBS scheme, and DVA Disability Pensioners.

The Daily Telegraph reported on 15th March 2014 "... that legislation will be introduced next week to reform the retirement scheme for the defence forces and boost their pensions in line with the cost of living. The changes will affect 57,000 retired servicemen and women and their families when the changes come in from July 1 this year, ending the inequity for those who had served more than 20 years in the defence forces."

The Bill finally passed both Houses on 27th March 2014 and, on 9th April 2014, the *Defence Force Retirement Benefits Legislation Amendment (Fair Indexation) Act 2014*, was assented. See: http://www.aph.gov.au/Parliamentary_Business/Bills_Legislation/Bills_Search_Results/Result?bId=r5195

Benefits:

- Free booklet of 5 concession stamps
- Ability to purchase up to 50 concession stamps per year
- Discount on Mail Hold and Mail Redirection
- A free MyPost Concession Card and digital mailbox.

How to apply:

1. Check if you're eligible using the list below
2. Complete and print out the application form
3. Take the form to your closest post office, along with your valid Federal Government concession card
4. Receive your free booklet of 5 stamps and your MyPost card in the mail within 14 days.

The following Australian Federal Government concession cards are accepted as proof of eligibility for a MyPost Concession Account:

Pensioner Concession Card, Health Care Card, Commonwealth Seniors Health Card, Department of Veterans' Affairs Card, Veterans' Repatriation Health Card
