Retired Member: Any person satisfying the above requirement for member who is now no longer working full time or is drawing a DVA, Age or TPI pension. Special cases shall be considered by the Vice-president.

Balcombe Barracks Commemoration 3 -5 May 2013

The Australian Army Apprentices' Association (AAAA) is hosting an event in Mornington, VICTORIA over the weekend 3rd to 5th May 2013.

The AAAA has been in consultation with the Mornington Peninsula Shire Council for some years with a view to upgrading and adding items to enhance the military historical significance of Balcombe as a featured component of the Shire heritage plan. AAAA Events has always endeavoured to conduct an activity of significance that calls for the active participation of the membership at around two yearly intervals.

It seemed fairly straight forward to combine the two things and in that way we should get a good turnout for the Commemoration and also for the reunion that we have put together. The two complement each other very nicely, and should make for a great weekend in Mornington.

2013 also represents the 70th anniversary of the 1st Div USMC being repatriated to Balcombe after their successful Guadalcanal campaign. The 4th of May 2013 marks the 71st anniversary of the start of the Battle of the Coral Sea. The Australian Army Apprentices took part in the annual celebration of this battle for many years by being the Army component in the allied forces contingent that marched through the City of Melbourne.

It was decided that all of this activity would attract many "Balcombe Old Boys and Girls" who would wish to be a part of the proceedings. So AAAA Events have come up with a number of activities to make this a most memorable few days, and probably the last time that Balcombe, Mornington and the district as a whole will appear on our radar.

This gathering is inclusive of all those units and personnel that served in Balcombe Barracks i.e., Apprentices, Signals, Survey, Music, US Marines, WRAAC and including staff.

RECENT APPRENTICE GATHERING IN PERTH

Way out in Western Australia on Saturday 26th May 2012 an ex apprentice afternoon gathering was conducted in the SAS Association 'House" at Campbell Barracks Swanbourne. With no starting contact list, local members Brian Cooper 9th and Norm Wells 14th beat the drum and spread the word for the planned family day which resulted in an attendance of over seventy five people of which 43 registered as past Army Apprentices ranging from the 3rd to the 48th intakes.

A further 20 odd "Apprenti" offered sincere apologies for their inability to attend due to sickness or prior commitment conflict.

The AAAA President Lucas McCann travelled from Melbourne to attend and address the gathering with the aim of recruiting stronger active association membership from Western Australia. The wonderful facility of the SAS House venue was a pleasure to enjoy with the walls adorned with interesting SAS historical memorabilia covering 55years of Australian SAS activities.

Attendees enjoyed the facility, the bar service and the arranged extensive catering provided by the SAS Association Committee who were thanked for their support to our function. The day was a great catch up with many old stories of military youth coming to mind. It was resolved that a repeat performance should be conducted maybe on an annual basis and all should go away and generate attendance numbers for any future gatherings.

The Australian Army Apprentices Memorial

With the construction of the memorial wall the memorial has now progressed another step towards its final design. The wall, constructed in the same brick and course as the Balcombe and Bonegilla wing walls, is edged in black glazed bricks with a black glazed cross in the centre. This wall will be reserved for plaques and memorabilia of those Apprentices lost in action. The wall also serves to better show the detail of the gates that was previously lost against the dark vegetation behind the memorial.

We still have to have fabricated and fixed, as funding becomes available, the wording "LEST WE FORGET" across the top of the wall and negotiate to have the KIA plaques from the Latchford avenue of intake trees transferred to the memorial.

RAEME have graciously passed to us a boulder with a brass plaque with Apprentice KIA that was behind their memorial; thanks to Jim Hislop, that has now has been placed at the front of the Memorial.

Peter McWhinney, the son of 10th Blacksmith Jock, has very generously donated the money to buy and install a reflection seat. We have laid the slab for the seat and it should be in place very shortly.

Future work includes the writing of a brochure explaining the significance of the various elements of the memorial and promoting the availability of inscribed pavers, bronze plaques and remembrance plaques. Details of these and application forms can be found on the Memorial page of the Apprentice web site. If you wish to have a Remembrance Plaque placed on the Balcombe or Bonegilla wall, I suggest you complete an Application Form, explain your wishes to your family and keep the form with your will.

AAS - SOME FACTS AND FIGURES

Trades

9,296 young men and women enlisted into the Australian Army to service as Army Apprentices. There were 1783 non-graduates, which include 25 apprentices who died whilst at AAS. Of these, 446 non-graduates went on to service in the Regular Army. There were 7,513 graduates into the following trades:

Architectural Draughtsman – 12	Electrical Fitter – 335	Plumber – 287
Blacksmith – 61	Electrical Mechanic – 365	Radio Mechanic/Electronic Tradesman – 1584
Bricklayer – 52	Electrician – 88	Vehicle Mechanic – 2224
Carpenter and Joiner – 781	Fitter and Turner – 1213	Welder – 8
Clerk – 118	Musician – 385	

Female Apprentices

There were 115 female Army Apprentices, of whom 49 did not graduate. For those who did graduate, their trades were:

Electronics – 32	Fitter and Turner – 5
Vehicle Mechanic – 28	Carpentry – 1

One is now a Major, two are Captains and three have reached WO2.

Operational Service

Many Army Apprentices have participated on overseas operational service, both warlike and nonwarlike. Some Apprentices have been on multiple operations. The number of individual Apprentices who have partaken in all these operations totals 2561:

Note: These figures include 145 non-graduates who partook in 205 operations.

Officers

There have been 762 Apprentices that have reached officer rank. This includes 36 non-graduates. There have also been six padres in that total.

There have also been 711 WO1s and 765 WO2s. In the higher ranks there have been:

1 x Lieutenant General	5 x Brigadiers
21 x Colonels	109 x Lieutenant Colonels

As of today, only 591 Apprentices remain in uniform – 351 in the ARA and 240 in the ARES.
