The Governor-General's Medal



Thanks to Basil Giffard, 3rd Intake Vehicle Mechanic, here is a copy of one of his 1951 bronze sporting medals. Basil reported that the medals were first presented at the graduation parade of the 1st and 2nd Intakes. This graduation ceremony, held in December 1951, was the first major event held on the newly completed oval, later named Mace Oval, after WO2 Mick Mace, RAE who was responsible for its construction. Basil also reported that the 1st Intake graduation parade had been delayed for six months to allow the 1st Intake to complete their training; they had been seriously disadvantaged due to them being heavily involved in the building and formation of the AAS. Basil received two medals for his sporting achievements whilst at the School. The inscription in the image on the left reads: "ATHLETICS – AWARDED TO – JAVELIN Under 17 – B.G. GIFFARD – 1951". Basil's other medal was for Under 17, 120 (yard) hurdles. Thanks Basil.

Also, John (Jack) Gamble, 4th Intake Carpenter and Joiner (C&J) reported that his mate Kevin Williamson, 2nd Intake C&J received a trade medal and also the Governor General's Medal. Jack himself received a silver medal for building trades and a bronze leadership medal. John stated, "Ray Gillespie (4th Intake Plumber) clipped me for the GG'S Medal, so I was led to believe."

This other (gold) image on the left shows that the medals were still being presented in the 1990s when the School was the Army College of TAFE in Bonegilla, which, as we know, was renamed to that in 1991.

Where are they now? – Lieutenant Colonel D.C. (Don) Hughes

Don Hughes was born on 16th Sep 1957 in Kew in Melbourne and attended Mt Waverley Primary and High Schools. He entered the Army Apprentices School in 1974 and graduated with the Trade Medal in Carpentry & Joinery to the RAE. He graduated from the Officer Cadet School, Portsea in 1978 and, after young officer corps training, was allocated as Tp Commander to 21 Construction Sqn, Puckapunyal. As a 2LT, Don commanded Resources Tp, Plant Tp and a combined construction team that built the “All Saints Chapel” in Townsville.

As a LT, Don commanded platoons at 1 RTB at Kapooka before an exchange posting to the British Army where he commanded “Le Cateau” Tp, Depot Regt, Royal Artillery at Woolwich, London.

Returning to Australia, as CAPT, he undertook an Operations & Training Staff appointment on HQ 5th Engineer Gp in Sydney before being selected to command the RAE Apprentice Sqn at SME Casula, Sydney. Appointment as Adjutant 7th Field Engineering Regt at Ringwood in Melbourne followed, before selection as Admin & Training Officer, 12th Chief Engineer Works, Mendi, PNG in 1988. After 3 years, he returned to Australia (Wagga Wagga) on promotion to MAJ and was appointed OC B Coy at 1 RTB.

In 1993, he was appointed Operations Staff Officer with the Logistic Support Force Engineers based at Oakleigh and was “shadow posted” as the Engineer Staff Officer for the Logistic Support Gp Operational Deployment Force. MAJ Hughes was selected to command the Australian Service Contingent deployed to the UN Peacekeeping Operation in Mozambique (ONUMOZ) undertaking demining operations. On return to Australia, Don became Chief Engineer for Southern Victoria before transferring to the Active Reserve in 1997 and commencing his own business. Active Reserve appointments include: OC 105th Construction Sqn, 2IC 4th Combat Engineer Regt and Staff Officer Operations HQ 4th Bde.

In 2000, Don was promoted to LTCOL and appointed CO 4th Combat Engineer Regt, deploying soldiers on Operation Gold in Sydney and Melbourne and also to the Joint Incident Response Unit. LTCOL Hughes then served on the Directing Staff of the Australian Technical Staff Officer Course (ATSOC) in 2002 (including honorary Visiting Military Fellow to the University of NSW). He also served on the Directing Staff of the Australian Command & Staff College (ACSC) at Weston Creek ACT until early 2005, when he transferred to the Standby Reserve. Don was the Military History and Maritime Operations Module Master and was involved in the Management Module with the University of Canberra (UCAN).

LTCOL Hughes has been a student at both ACSC Fort Queenscliff and Weston Creek, ACT. He is a graduate of the University of New England where he was awarded a Bachelor of Professional Studies (Management) and holds a Grad Dip in Defence Management from UCAN. Don is a qualified builder.

For LTCOL Hughes’ service in PNG, he was awarded the PNG 10th Anniversary of Independence Medal. He has also been awarded the UN Medal for Operations in Mozambique and the UN Special Service Medal for Humanitarian Demining operations.

In civilian life, Don has been awarded the “Silver Arrowhead” for excellent service to the Scout Association of Australia, a Baptcare Certificate of Recognition for Exceptional Service in the Aged Care Industry and a Sir Robert Menzies Australia Day Award for community service in the Federal Electorate of Menzies.

Don is married to Michelle and they have three adult children. He was elected in 2014 as the Vice President of the RAE Association (Vic) Inc.





Welfare Report

The Welfare Officer seldom has good news but fulfils an important role for the Association and hopefully to members. The job relies heavily on being made aware of bereavements and hospitalisations or of the need for welfare advice by a member or spouse. The Welfare Officer may also contact the NOK to determine any need for a Welfare Officer from the local RSL to visit or assist. The Welfare Officer may also provide advice. I have taken on this role until a member steps up to join the Committee as our Welfare Officer. I hope I am not kept too busy in the coming months.
